Courses taken for advanced certificate program may be applied to the Master of Science in Accountancy or Master of Science in Business Administration degrees with the recommendation of the program adviser and approval from the Division of Graduate Affairs.

- Students must complete the 12 units of certificate coursework with a minimum grade point average of 3.0 with no
  grade lower than a C (2.0).
- The Taxation Advanced Certificate must be completed within six years and a student must maintain good academic standing.
- Transfer limits for most advanced certificate programs are limited to a maximum of three units including courses taken through SDSU Global Campus. For advanced certificates requiring more than 12 units, maximum transfer limits are 30% of degree units and must have the recommendation of the program adviser and the Dean of Graduate Affairs.

Current Degree Students adding Advanced Certificate:	Certificate Students Only:
Students in an advanced degree program that wish to add the advanced certificate concurrently must be formally admitted no later than halfway through the units required for the advanced certificate. Student must submit the <i>Request for Permission to Enter an Advanced Certificate Program</i> (found on grad.sdsu.edu). The Graduate Business Department and Graduate Affairs will determine whether the student meets the minimum eligibility requirements of the program before admitting the student into the certificate program.	<ul> <li>A student wishing to be admitted to an advanced certificate (currently not seeking other Master Degree) must meet the criteria specified under General Admission Requirements.</li> <li>Submit Application: complete an application and the \$70 nonrefundable, nontransferable application fee. Online applications are available at http://www.calstate.edu/apply</li> <li>Submit Documentation: recently issued (printed within the last year) official transcripts from all institutions attended and English proficiency if applicable.</li> <li>Submit Program Documents: upload a resume and written responses to the application prompts using Interfolio.</li> </ul>
